Welcome to the January 2012 Edition of **EDUCATE News!**

The Jury of the EDUCATE Prize - the International Student Award launched by EDUCATE to reward students' work and innovative pedagogical methods promoting sustainable environmental design in curricula of higher education – convened on the 27th and 28th of January in Munich (Germany) at the Haus der Architektur, Bayerische Architektenkammer (ByAK, Bavarian Chamber of Architects).

The assessment process was coordinated by the Technische Universität München (Hana Riemer and Barbara Hausmann) in collaboration with staff from the Bayerische Architektenkammer.

Chaired by **Oliver Heiss** (Architect and Urban Planner) of ByAK, the independent Jury included the following representatives of European Chambers of Architects:

Over the two days of assessment, the members of the Jury thoroughly analysed nearly a hundred entries submitted from all over the world to the EDUCATE Prize, under 3 Categories:

Category I: Student Design Projects (Year of study 1-3, Undergraduate Degrees)

Category II: Student Design Projects (Year of study 4-6, Graduate / Postgraduate degrees)

Category III: Open Student Work (all Years of study)

The nominated finalists for each Category of the Prize (Award winners and Honorary mentions) will be contacted individually at the beginning of February 2012.

The final results of the assessment process will be announced at the **EDUCATE Prize Award Ceremony**, which will take place in the context of a Symposium on Education for Sustainability to be held in Rome (Italy) on the 23rd February 2012. The Symposium will be hosted by the Department DATA, University of Rome La Sapienza, and by the Ordine degli Architetti, Pianificatori, Paesaggisti e Conservatori di Roma e Provincia.

Following the Award Ceremony, the winning entries of the EDUCATE Prize will be presented on the webpage <http://www.educate-sustainability.eu/prize> and will be featured in a Printed Newsletter that will be distributed to academic and professional institutions throughout Europe.
